Year 3/4 Topic Overview- Summer 2: USA Far and Away

English
In English we will be focusing on non-fiction texts this half term, including writing non-chonological reports to inform the reader all about Native Americans.

Years 3s will be learning about 2D and 3D shape, and statistics including pictograms and bar charts.

Year 4s will also be learning about shape, with a focus on position and direction.

Geography

We will be learning:

- -the names and location of a number of North American countries using a range of maps and globes.
- -key differences between living in the UK and the USA including human and physical features e.g. mountain ranges, rivers, great plains, grand canyon and major cities
- -types of settlement and land use, e.g. gold mines, building of train lines across USA, why cities are where they are.

Science

Our science unit this half term is states of matter. We will be learning about solids, liquids and gases, observing that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled and learning about evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.

RE

Our big questions is: Why is belief important to some people? We will be looking at the meaning of 'faith' and 'belief', including learning about some famous role models and how their beliefs guide them.
