

Reception Topic overview- Spring 1: Winter and Cold Places

Communication, Language and Literacy

Phase 3 phonics: we will be learning all phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, er, ur, ow, oi, ear, air.

We will be learning all phase 3 tricky words.

We will introduce non-fiction books.
We will use these books to find information on polar animals.
We will write facts about polar animals

Maths

We will start to look at teen numbers being made up of 1 ten and ones.

Understanding the World

We look at how the seasons change considering winter.

We will explore the Polar regions and how they are different to where we live, through books and videos.

We will explore maps and globes to find out where the polar regions are.

We will discover many polar animals!
We will experiment and see what happens when water freezes and melts.

Physical Development
Gymnastics- introducing children to the gymnastics equipment and wall bars.

Learning how to move over and across the equipment safely.
Developing their balance and learning how to jump and land safely.

Daily handwriting sessions, focusing on letter formation.

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Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Identify and moderate feelings both socially and emotionally - we will focus on this using our class charter, appropriate books and through circle times.

RSE Week: We look at how we have changed since we are babies and how we will continue to change.

We will think about how to keep our bodies clean and healthy.

We will consider how to dress appropriately in the winter to look after ourselves.

We hope to welcome a scientist from the British Antarctic Survey towards the end of January.
